Year 4 Termly Curriculum Plan for Parents-Summer 2017

<p>Religious Education</p>	<p>Easter – look at the accounts of the Resurrection in the four Gospels. Learn about the different reactions of the people to the news that Christ was alive. Pentecost – to study this story and the effects that it had on the disciples. Learn about the missionary activities of the disciples. Sharing in the Life of Christ – Learn about the Universal Church established on the original teaching of the apostles. Special Roles and Responsibilities – the children will learn about the different tasks and responsibilities given to the people in the Church. The units of work above will be conversed whilst referring to the UNICEF articles through class discussion.</p>
<p>Maths</p>	<p>Pupils will :</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • To estimate and use inverse operations to check answers • To recognise and use factor pairs • To add and subtract fractions • Recall multiplication facts up to 12 x 12 • To solve problems using multiplication and division • To measure and calculate the perimeter of rectilinear shapes • To present and interpret discrete data • To read, write and convert time between the digital and analogue clock.
<p>English</p>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • To engage in meaningful discussions in all areas of the curriculum • Ask relevant questions to extend their understanding and knowledge • Read, re-read and rehearse poems and plays for performance using intonation and expression • Develop understanding, inference and prediction skills of a number of books • To plan their writing through discussion, write the text and then edit to improve • Create characters settings and plots • Extending the range of sentences with more than one clause by using a wider range of conjunctions, including when, if, because, although • Using commas after fronted adverbials
<p>Topics</p>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Sound • States of Matter • Local History – The Tudors • To use sculpture to create people or scenery • To use code (Scratch) • To make Ipod cases using textiles. • To investigate patterns in our world. • In June, there will be a KS2 afternoon workshop on anti-bullying.
