Assessment of Children

Following the introduction of a new National Curriculum in 2014, there are new expectations for children in each year group. Expectations are higher than the previous curriculum. In many year groups items from a higher year group have been brought into a lower one for children to achieve at an earlier age i.e:

- Five-year-olds will be expected to learn to count up to 100 (compared to 20 under the old curriculum) and learn number bonds to 20 (previously up to 10)
- Simple fractions (1/4 and 1/2) will be taught from KS1, and by the end of primary school, children should be able to convert decimal fractions to simple fractions (e.g. 0.375 = 3/8)
- By the age of nine, children will be expected to know times tables up to 12x12 (previously 10x10 by the end of KS2) with more emphasis on the skills of mathematical modelling and problem-solving.

Understanding the Information at Parents Evening

Our mid-year parents' evening will take place over two evenings next week. Your child's books will be available in the classroom, for your perusal, prior to the meeting. We ask that you respect everyone's privacy and only look at your own child's books. Please take the books in to the meeting with the teacher, if you wish, where you can celebrate their achievements, progress and discuss future targets.

The teachers will be discussing your child's current progress and whether they are on track to meet what is the NEW National Age Related Expectation for their year group by the end of the academic year. They will also be discussing how we can work together to best support your child so they reach their full potential.

'Old' national curriculum levels (e.g. Level 3, 4, 5) have now been abolished. The DFE have introduced the following terminology:

- Pupil is Working towards National Age Related Expectations for their year group.
- Pupil is Working at National Age Related Expectations for their year group.
- Pupil is Working at greater depth compared to National Age Related Expectations for their year group.

Obviously, now that children are being expected to work at a higher and more intense level than has been previously demanded, at this moment in time many children will be judged to be 'working towards' in many areas of the curriculum, but by looking through the books and discussing with your child it will be clear the scale of progress made from the start of the school year.

We have been very pleased with the efforts that the children are making to 'raise the bar'. We look forward to seeing you next week.


Walk to School

Cars on Site
